



CALL TO ARTISTS AND PROGRAM OUTLINE

The Idaho Conservation League offers the Artist in Residence program on an annual basis. This collaboration between artists and conservationists provides an artistic way for observers to consider ICL's work: the places, resources and species that ICL protects throughout Idaho. This program is intended to foster wider public awareness of the work of both the Idaho Conservation League and the artist through a creative and engaging project.

Idaho artists working in visual arts and who have an online presence are encouraged to apply. Each artist is expected to complete a body of work to be exhibited in an event(s) promoted by the Idaho Conservation League and the artist during the calendar year of their residency. The format of this event will depend upon the character of the art, and will be organized primarily by the artist with implementation assistance from the Idaho Conservation League.

The Idaho Conservation League will benefit financially and promotionally by the artist's work. ICL will be granted use, at no charge, of the images the artist creates as a part of the residency for promotional purposes, throughout the artist's residency and as part of ICL's image archives in perpetuity. In addition, ICL will receive a 25% commission on the sale of all pieces created for the residency and sold during the artist's tenure. The artist will benefit by ICL's promotion of the artist and Artist in Residence program through print, web, social media, and other means. Details of benefits to ICL and artist will be agreed upon at commencement of each residency.

There is a modest stipend that will help the artist cover some costs of the expected work and exhibit. The ICL Artist in Residence program is sponsored by ARTA River Trips and ARTA offers one guided trip on an Idaho river for the ICL artist in residence every year. This is not a physical residency, and is open to artists throughout the state of Idaho.
